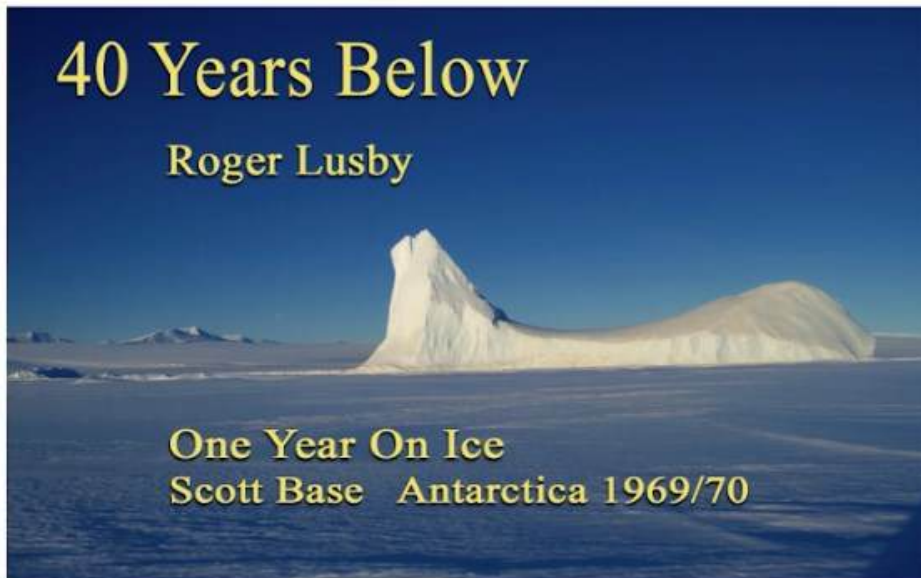

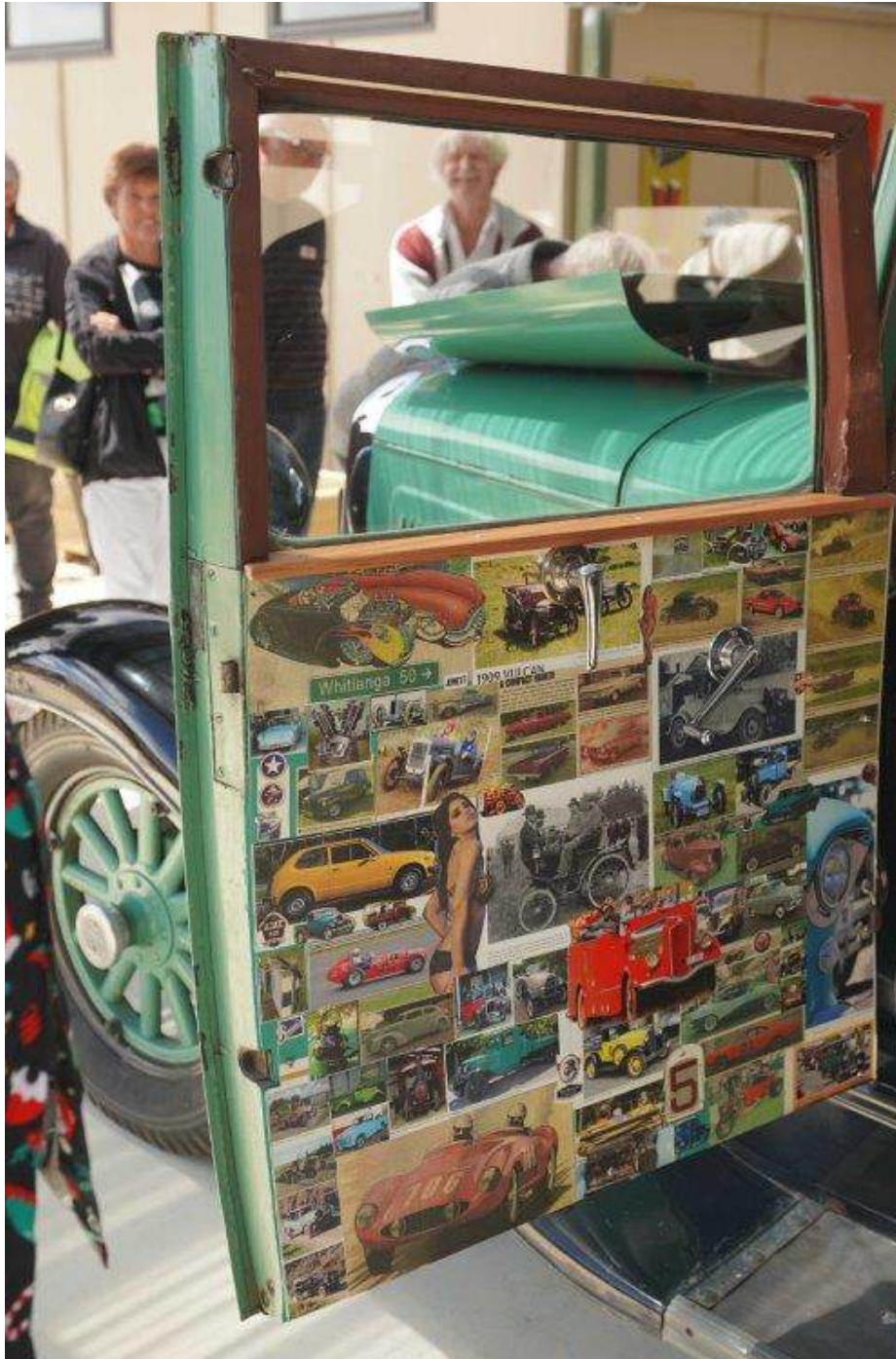

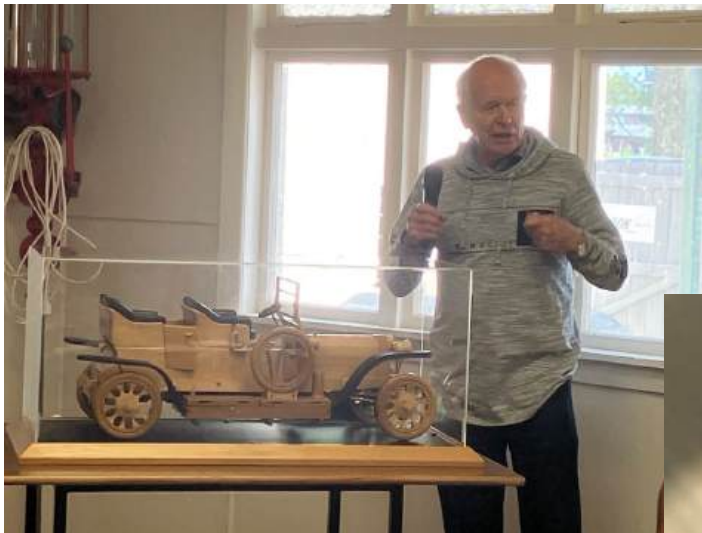

The Newman Bros started their first coach service in 1879, initially only reaching Longford, 3 km from Murchison, due to the need to ford the Buller. There were no passengers and the brothers carried the mail bag onto Murchison and the public reception lead by George Moonlight, publican, and others.

**On EASTER SATURDAY, 4<sup>th</sup> APRIL, from 10am,** a Parade of historic vehicles will be taking place and we would very much like you to bring your 'old girl' down for the event. signs and vehicle frames to display the signs advertising the event coming to Nelson and Tasman in 2026

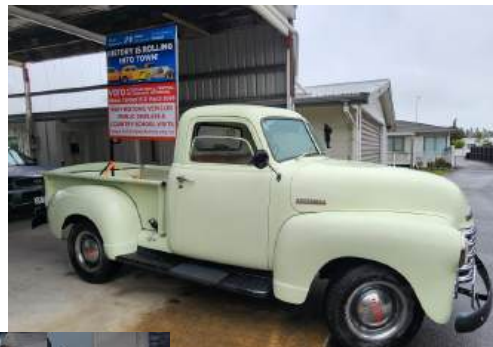
