



Representing the Nelson Branch, I attended as Observer, with Mike attending in a representative capacity and Ray delivering his report on behalf of Vero. Following a welcome by President George Kear, the meeting covered a broad range of national matters. ☐ Club Procedures Manual A draft of the newly named "Club Procedures Manual" has been circulated to all branches. This updated resource will eventually be published on the national website. In the meantime, members are encouraged to contact a committee member if they'd like to review it. ☐ Daffodil Rally for Cancer George presented **Karen's report**, sharing the exciting news that Ford NZ has been successfully secured as a nationwide sponsor. A great step forward for this significant fundraising event. ☐ National Office – New Building Andy Fox presented details of the work involved in securing new national premises, including location selection, building refurbishment, and the relocation process. Members are welcome to visit the

#### Irishman Rally Kings Birthday Weekend 2025 - Joanne Hoffman

We arrived at the Canterbury Club Rooms in total darkness, eager to secure the ideal parking spot for an easy exit through the gates. Unfortunately, so had the other 180-odd vehicles.

Just on 8 a.m., the much-anticipated drivers' briefing began. It was short and to the point: have fun, obey the road rules, be considerate, and collect your day's run sheets as you exit the park.

Then came the chaos. Everyone returned to their vehicles, followed by the familiar sounds of engines turning over—or not. A few bonnets were up, with frustrated owners peering in to diagnose reluctant starts.

Once through the gates, it was simply a matter of following instructions: left, right, continue... Those became the words of the day—along with the repeated question, "How many more straight gravel roads?"



We travelled through the Rakaia Gorge and onto Methven, and the only fuel stop for the day, then onto to Mt Somers—with the advise of "the last toilet stop until well after lunch".

Instruction 48 read: "Turn left at sign for Mt Possession & Edendale Stations."

At the gate, a marshal said, "Drive over the bridge and look to the right—you might spot some bison." Sure enough, moments later, we saw the herd of Bison.

What an incredible station—18,000 hectares in the Mid-Canterbury foothills, farming deer and bison — and we had the privilege of driving through it, marvelling at the vast landscape. In the shelter of some hedges, we paused to enjoy our packed lunches.

Then it was back on the road toward Fairlie, with plenty more gravel, a few water crossings, and dust to spare. We reached our accommodation just as darkness fell.



## **Sunday: Frosty, Friendly, and Full of Adventure**

Sunday morning greeted us with a sharp frost and biting cold. Rugged up warmly, we made our way to the starting point in Cave. As we parked, we wandered about, chatted, and got to know our fellow travellers and their stories.

At 8:30 a.m., we gathered for another quick and cheerful briefing. "Line up at the end of the road at 9 a.m. You'll get your run sheet just before you take a sharp left and head up a steep hill."

Eager to get going, we jumped in Annabel our Model A followed closely by Rex and Lynette in Myrtel their Essex and drove to the start point —only to realise, with a slight jolt of panic, that we were first in line! With Rex and Lynnette right behind us.

Vern turned to me and said, "Well, we'd better not make any mistakes—everyone's following us. No pressure, Jo."

Not long into the route, we came across the first water crossing. "No problem," I thought. We cruised through the water just fine—but the bank on the far side was nearly vertical (or so it seemed!). With a bit of power and lots of bumping, we shot up the incline, Rex close behind.

Next came a steep, winding hill. After reaching the top, we pulled over to watch others climb. Five more Model A's joined us—but then, silence. The last driver told us the bank was getting slippery; later we heard around 20 cars had to be towed up. Many opted for the alternate route.

We continued on, through Shenley Station, then onto the MacKenzie Pass Road to cross the MacKenzie Pass itself. The afternoon was spent at Pete's Patch with a car gymkhana and a good old catchup. 


